Thank you, Topping Rose House, for our third annual holiday dinner. There was an excited buzz as 98 friends and supporters gathered for our gourmet dinner. The delicious food was overseen by the celebrated chef, Jean-Georges, who circulated among the guests in signature toque and white apron. The menu more than lived up to his reputation. The star of the evening, though, was The Center. Bonnie Cannon, the Center's Director, described the educational and recreational programs offered to our underserved local population of African-American and Latino children as well as our desperate need for more space. THE DREAM IS NOW

The Center's programs are filled to overflowing, which is wonderful on one hand, but also sad because we've had to turn away children from our fully subscribed After School program. (NY State dictates minimum space per child.) We

urgently need to expand our facilities and have architectural plans in hand to renovate and add to our original farmhouse, donated to establish The Center in the 50's, to provide more classrooms, a computer lab, community education space, offices and bathroom facilities. The new building will be attached to the farmhouse and allow the children who are on our wait list to benefit from our educational and enrichment programs. Our architect estimates the cost of the new building to be \$1,500,000. We already have gifts close to \$300,000, but we need to close that gap. The children's hearts would be full if you could help us reach our goal, which would include naming rights.





TEEN PROGRAM
